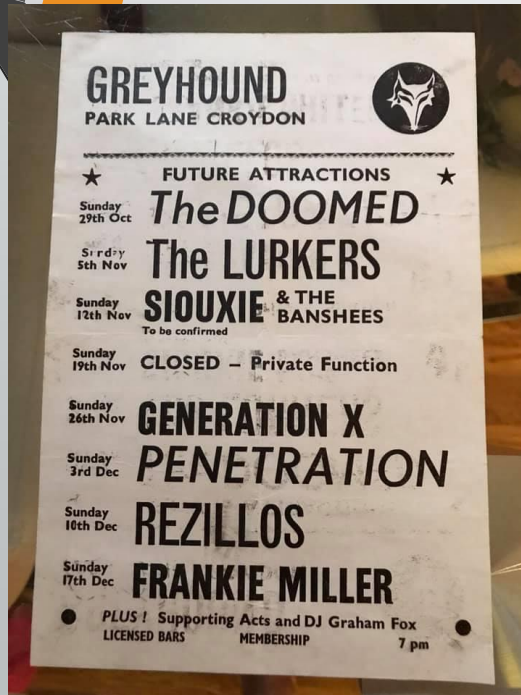
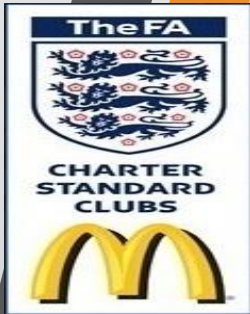

Surrey Premier Cup

Redhill U23s 0 1s 5

On Thursday 18th November, Old Wilsonians' 1st XI travelled to take on Redhill U23s in the Surrey FA County Cup. Unbeaten in four, the OWs were quietly confident of getting a result against the 'non-league' outfit. A 13-man squad – bolstered by three current Wilson's school boys – made the journey into deep Surrey. With Parky stepping in as temporary manager given Barry's history with Redhill (and subsequent de facto ban from the ground), the stage was well and truly set. Under the lights, 7:45 KO; this game was personal, and at that, the match began.

OWs dominated the ball from the off, and it began to seem inevitable that this would soon pay dividends. In the early exchanges, **Ben Giles** had attempted to score from outside the box with his weak foot, only to produce a timid effort straight down the keeper's throat. A few minutes later, he was faced with an identical chance. An inferior player may have shied away from the opportunity; not Gilo. From all of 25 yards, Gilo's left-footed curling strike nestled in the top left-hand corner, giving the keeper no chance. OWs 1-0 - the boys were on their way.

Having established a foothold in the game, the OWs continued to dominate play. Tom Hubner would go incredibly close with a swerving effort smacking the crossbar from at least 30 yards out before the OWs - unsurprisingly - doubled their lead. After some sustained pressure, the ball fell kindly to **Kieran Steadford** who hit a powerful effort goalward. A cruel deflection saw the ball hit the back of the net, and the OWs lead increased.

Was it an **Own Goal**? Could Kieran truly claim this goal as his? These questions continue to haunt me. I must come to terms with the fact that we will never know. Soon thereafter, the Half Time whistle blew and the boys headed into the changing room 2-0 up at the break.

After a Half Time team talk spent mostly debating whether we were meant to be marking man-to-man or zonally from corners (answers on a postcard), the OWs headed out for the 2nd Half with renewed energy and purpose - this game simply must be won for Barry. Immediately, the power of this messaging was displayed. Directly from Kick Off in just seven passes, the OWs scored a third goal, Alex Karamath playing a delightful chipped ball over the top to **Sam Moody** who finished boldly. OWs 3-0 - the boys were out for blood.

The game had now been settled as a contest, and this gave the OWs a chance to get the ball on the ground and play some fluid football. The patterns of play on show wouldn't have been out of place at the elite level with the OWs at one point keeping possession for ten uninterrupted minutes.

It was Redhill who should be credited with the OWs fourth goal however and - more specifically - their manager. Just as youth is no guarantee of innovation, age is no guarantee of wisdom, and the Redhill gaffer sought to demonstrate the latter, doing so by stubbornly instructing his side to play out from the back despite their obvious inability to do so. After numerous close escapes courtesy of some wasteful OWs finishing, **Moody** finally capitalised on a Redhill playing out from the back error and grabbed his second of the match. OWs 4-0 - the boys were running riot.

The tempo of the game began to slow as time passed and it seemed as though the score line may stay unchanged; not quite. **Kwesi**, who had been a menace throughout the game, topped off his mercurial performance with a well-taken goal driven into the bottom right corner from a cutback. OWs 5-0 - the ground belonged to us now.

Petulance crept into the opposition's game as their frustration grew, this realised on the multiple occasions where they refused to give the ball back to us after we had put it out of play to allow their players to receive treatment for injuries. For the OWs, this was simply not on. GK Matt Powelly let his feelings known verbally and CB Will Straw let his feelings known physically, a hearty tackle through the back of the opposition number 9 underlining OWs' unhappiness with the lack of manners on show. Superficially, this was just a foul but undoubtedly more deeply, a riposte to Redhill's lack of football etiquette.

A late tackle on Dan Sellman saw the referee call an end to proceedings and the game draw to a close. The OWs had emerged victorious and some. Visibly moved by the day's events, Sellman was overcome by emotion at Full Time and indulged in a solo moment of reflection on the Redhill pitch. He knew that this result was bigger than him. Indeed, it was bigger than all of us. Hell, it was bigger than OWs. This result was for Barry and, even more importantly, for football justice.

The lightning quick centre half pairing of Will Straw and James Paton had secured another clean sheet with the help of the ever-present Kara at LB and the impressive schoolboy Jasper at RB. Attacking phases of play were dictated effectively by the midfield and supported by the honesty of Moody, Riman, Kwesi and Piralash up top. Simply, a consummate team display was the best descriptor of the OWs performance.

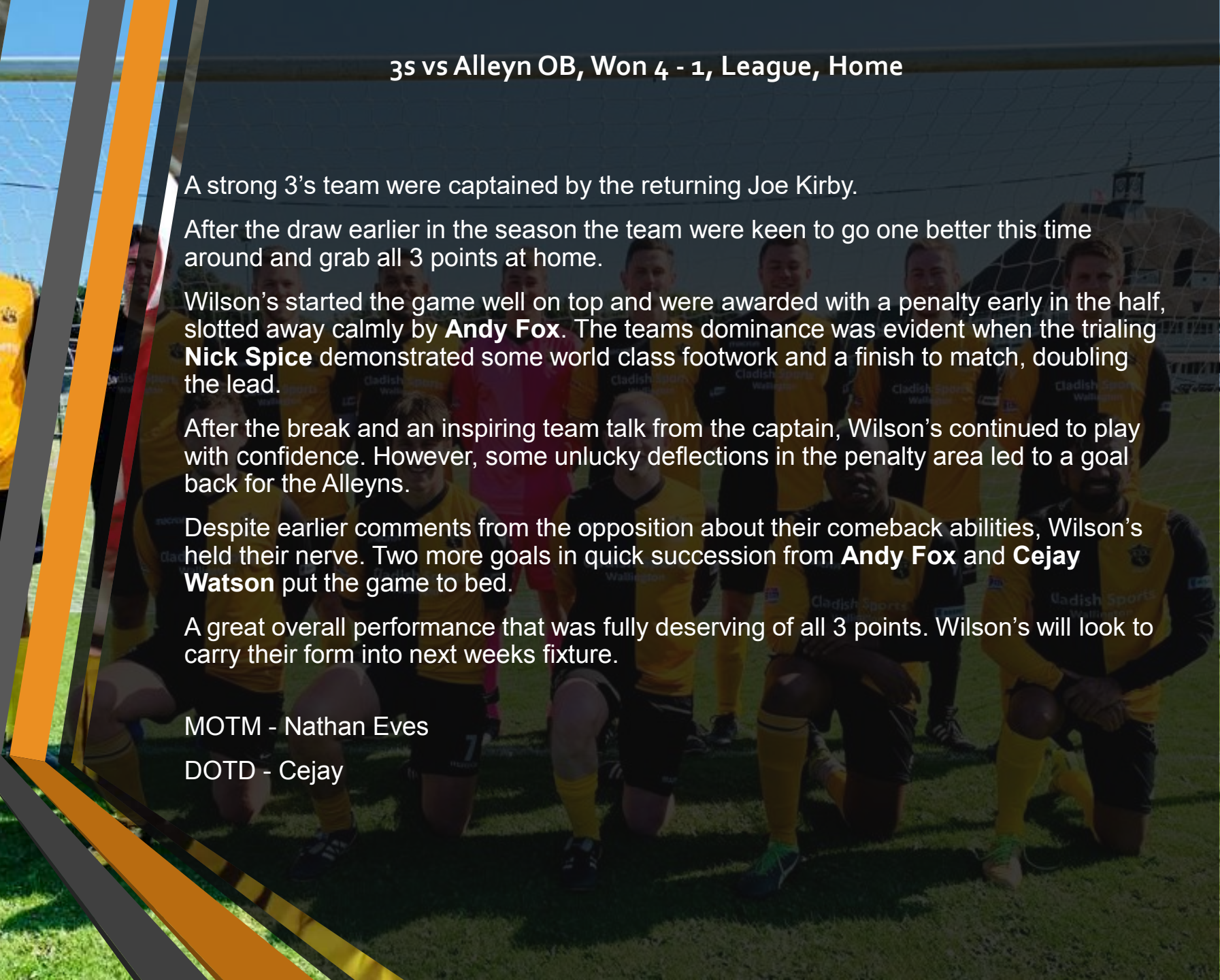

A 'sick' game

Playing on our favourite Hayes pitch and after a dreadful run of results we had a cup game against our old boys rivals. For the first time this season we had a team that knew each other and everyone had played for the 6s!

We stuck to a traditional 4-4-2 ensuring that everyone knew their places and to give us a solid defence. In recent weeks we have conceded too many too early. From the off we put ourselves under some pressure however. We were finding our feet on a bobbly pitch that had Sparrow reffing the 3s on only moments before our game. The game settled into a good rhythm as we broke up any play the opposition head with a bit of ferocity all over the pitch. The press was great wherever we were and we were able to stay composed whenever we won the ball, allowing us to play our way. Robbins was calm, making saves when needed and distributing the ball well. We conceded a few corners and from that conceded and unnecessary goal, almost immediately we blundered the ball playing it around near the back and gifted a third. REASELEY AND SIMNER ENSURE COMFORTABLE VICTORY Old Adeyans 1 1st XI 6

Arriving at the ground at zero hour minus two after an exhausting journey of ten minutes from Hayes, the 1st XI kicked off with nine men. But, and despite a few mishaps at the back, we were beginning to gain control of the game when the two 'Puffing Billy's' chugged in.

It would be heartless to say that they might not have bothered, not because of their personal displays, but because the opposition were not really very good. Given time to play at their own pace they could work out some pretty moves, but the 1st XI were quicker to the ball for most of the game and able to harass opponents into mistakes. In turn we were allowed time to control the ball and space to lay it off. Consequently there were fluent moves in midfield and up-front, whilst the back four could always find someone to pass to.
