OWFC Business Code of Conduct / Annual Subs

A new season is upon us . With a further influx of juniors and schoolboys , plus training and a couple of teams playing through the summer. Our hopes are high. We have 7 teams on Saturday & the Vets on Sundays playing league football . Supervets will continue to play friendlies on Sundays.

We have kept annual subs for 21s & over in employment to £150 & under 21s in employment £75, both pay £10 weekly subs . If you are playing 4 or less games you will pay £20 match fees , but no annual subs. Junior members paying annual subs to the junior section & schoolboys pay no annual subs but pay £5 weekly subs. Vets due to the number of games pay annual subs , Supervets pay £50 annual subs & £10 per game match .

Unemployed please chat to your skipper or Stu Dunk (treasurer or me (asst treasurer) and we will agree something that is workable for you as we want you to play . Annual subs are due on 30th September 2025 . We are using Pitchero & you should have an email to confirm your details, receive newsletters , about events also paying your annual subs or outstanding fines like yellow and red cards.

Why the rise in annual subs ? our rent to the association has gone up by 7.5% this season taking it above £24,000 per annum . The reason is ground maintenance (looking after both hayes & Hawesdown) costs £71,000 per year (up from £60,000 last season due mainly to the extra cost of running Hawesdown), utilities has gone from £21,000 in 2021 to over £54,000 in 2025. So it is important you pay your annual subs on time as we look to break even. Its also important you support events not only so you meet players from other teams but also have some fun & hopefully we make a bit of money , which will hopefully keep your annual subs as low as possible Also find a code of conduct we expect all our member to follow. Please read them as this is the minimum we expect as a club. Here's to a great season , good luck & enjoy

Code of Conduct

As a representative of the Old Wilsonians Football Club, I agree that;

On and off the pitch, I will:

- Always play the game fairly and in the right spirit.
- Be aware of the impact of bad language; keep spectators and members of the public - including children - in mind.
- Never verbally abuse a match official, player or spectator based their appearance, race, religion, gender or sexuality. Doing so could lead to dismissal from the field, suspension and possible police action.
- Never physically assault a match official, player or spectator. Doing so could lead to dismissal from the field, suspension and possible police action.
- Help to create a safe and inclusive environment both on and off the pitch.
- Report all allegations of abuse or poor practice to the Club Welfare Officer.
- Not to abuse, neglect, harm or discriminate against anyone; or act in a way that may be interpreted as such.
- Adhere to the club's safeguarding policy, rules and regulations.
- Attend the match with correct kit, this includes black shorts and gold socks.
- Arrive on time. If for any reason I may be late, I will inform my captain as soon as possible.
- Respect the decisions made by my captain.
- Not drop out from the game at short notice. This is unfair to other players who may have been left out, so that I could play. If I have a valid reason, I will inform my captain. Failure to contact my captain will result in being reported to the disciplinary committee.

Selection, finances and expected conduct.

- I understand, if I have made myself available to play, I will be expected to represent any team within the Old Wilsonians football club, as per rule 11 of the OWFC rules.
- I will sign up to the FA Matchday app.
- I will pay my annual and weekly subs on time. If I am unable to do this, I will inform the club treasurer who may be able to assist.
- I will conduct myself in such a manner as not to bring the Old Wilsonians football club into disrepute.
- I will not be involved with/under the influence of any drugs or illegal substances whilst representing the football club, in line with the OWFC drugs policy.
- When playing at home, I will help when required to offer hospitality to the visiting teams and complete requested duties.
- I understand the expectation that I support the club with fundraising events and activities.
- I understand that I need to provide the club with any personal data required for registration and/or safeguarding purposes.
- I will refrain from any criminal activity. I will represent the club with integrity and honesty.

I understand: If I do not follow the Code, I may expect to:

- Be cautioned, sin binned or sent off by the match officials, depending on the nature of the offence.
 - Be asked to apologize to whoever I have offended or abused.
 - Be disciplined by my club via the disciplinary committee, including being substituted, dropped, given a formal warning, suspended from training or matches or a permanent suspension from the club. This will depend on the nature of the offence.
 - Be disciplined by the County Football Association, including being fined or suspended for a number of matches depending on the nature of the offence.
 - Be handed a permanent exclusion by the FA or County Football Association if the offence is deemed serious enough.
- Declaration: I agree to abide by the conditions above and follow any guidance or policy as set out by Old Wilsonians football club, The AFA (County FA) or the Football Association.

Old Wilsonians 2nd XI 7-0 Economicals

After an underwhelming performance in the cup the previous week, the Old Wilsonians 2nd XI returned to home soil raring to bounce back from their disappointing defeat.

The game started slowly, with the opposition sitting deep and the boys struggling to find the net in the opening 20 minutes, despite creating a couple of chances. After 25 minutes, a few of the lads—clearly still feeling the effects of a few too many mince pies over Christmas—were withdrawn and replaced with some fresh legs, which immediately provided a greater attacking threat.

This change seemed to shift the momentum and bring a new spark to the game. Mazing runs from Catton, combined with excellent defensive work from Clutts, allowed the attacking front three to slice through a weak Economicals side. Exquisite link-up play followed, with Jake netting in the first half and Ryan making an immediate impact grabbing two goals coming off the bench. As the half drew to a close, the boys were pleased with their performance but remained eager to maintain their levels and avoid letting the opposition back into the game.

The second half saw Wilsonians truly assert their dominance as the game opened up. Relentless forward momentum kept Economicals pinned back in their own half, and Jake opened the scoring again with some brilliant attacking flare through the middle. It would be unfair not to mention the outstanding defensive display from the back four, highlighted by some crunching tackles from Fitz that prime Roy Keane would have been proud of.

With the defence standing firm and allowing nothing past them, play progressed up the field, resulting in a moment of magic from Marley Quashie, who produced a wonder strike from 40 yards with his screamer somehow looping over the keeper and slotting into the bottom-right corner. There was a clear swagger about Wilsonians, built on confidence and control, that had yet to emerge so far this season. Another goal soon followed, this time from Jonny, who calmly slotted home to extend the lead to six.

With the game well and truly done and dusted, things began to get a little silly as Centre-back Shelts found himself in unmarked territory deep in the opposition half and, with no passing options (not that he was looking for one), he unleashed an absolute rocket towards goal. All 22 players watched in disbelief as the ball flew goalwards, only to sail over the bar and wedge itself into a nearby tree.

To round off a magnificent victory, Billy was introduced much to the confusion of himself and his teammates at right wing however, he did not disappoint, producing some tricky play down the right wing before delivering a delightful cross that found Marley, who bagged his second goal of the day. This capped off an absolute onslaught, with the match ending Old Wilsonians 7–0 Economicals, earning a fully deserved three points for the league tally.

The boys will now look to build on this performance as they face London Welsh on Saturday.

Old Tenisonians 3s vs Old Wilsonians 4s – Cup Last 16 Match Report

Old Wilsonians 4s booked their place in the quarter-finals with a commanding victory over Old Tenisonians 3s in the last 16 of the cup, though the scoreline only told part of the story.

Wilsonians fielded a strong side, boosted by returning players and a guest appearance from Louis—on loan from the higher ranks or the lower ranks, depending on who you ask. Despite the pedigree, the opening exchanges were scrappy, with little football played and Tenisonians' striker causing problems by dropping into the number ten role. This led to several early scares, all expertly dealt with by Rory, deputising in goal after George prioritised childcare over clean sheets—an admirable, if frustrating, choice.

Against the run of play, Wilsonians struck first. Terell held the ball up superbly on the left before releasing Ash on his only overlapping run of the day. Ash's inch-perfect cross was met by Sam Margetts, who thundered home a bullet header.

The goal failed to spark immediate control, but that arrived soon after when Craig spotted Tom's run with a ball over the top. Tom's movement created space for Terell to arrive late and finish calmly over the keeper. Louis then added a moment of brilliance, looping an audacious effort from outside the box into the top-left corner.

The tie was effectively sealed before half-time when Luke Curran's corner was powered home by the unmarked Joseph.

Wilsonians tightened their grip after the break, denying the chances previously conceded and dominating possession. This control produced a fifth goal as Tom switched play to Joseph, whose first touch eliminated his marker before he smashed into the bottom-left corner.

Despite further chances, wasteful finishing kept the score respectable. Still, Wilsonians progressed deservedly, setting their sights firmly on a semi-final berth as a minimum expectation.
