OWFC Business Code of Conduct / Annual Subs

A new season is upon us . With a further influx of juniors and schoolboys , plus training and a couple of teams playing through the summer. Our hopes are high. We have 7 teams on Saturday & the Vets on Sundays playing league football . Supervets will continue to play friendlies on Sundays.

We have kept annual subs for 21s & over in employment to £150 & under 21s in employment £75, both pay £10 weekly subs . If you are playing 4 or less games you will pay £20 match fees , but no annual subs. Junior members paying annual subs to the junior section & schoolboys pay no annual subs but pay £5 weekly subs. Vets due to the number of games pay annual subs , Supervets pay £50 annual subs & £10 per game match .

Unemployed please chat to your skipper or Stu Dunk (treasurer or me (asst treasurer) and we will agree something that is workable for you as we want you to play . Annual subs are due on 30th September 2025 . We are using Pitchero & you should have an email to confirm your details, receive newsletters , about events also paying your annual subs or outstanding fines like yellow and red cards.

Why the rise in annual subs ? our rent to the association has gone up by 7.5% this season taking it above £24,000 per annum . The reason is ground maintenance (looking after both hayes & Hawesdown) costs £71,000 per year (up from £60,000 last season due mainly to the extra cost of running Hawesdown), utilities has gone from £21,000 in 2021 to over £54,000 in 2025. So it is important you pay your annual subs on time as we look to break even. Its also important you support events not only so you meet players from other teams but also have some fun & hopefully we make a bit of money , which will hopefully keep your annual subs as low as possible Also find a code of conduct we expect all our member to follow. Please read them as this is the minimum we expect as a club. Here's to a great season , good luck & enjoy

Code of Conduct

As a representative of the Old Wilsonians Football Club, I agree that;

On and off the pitch, I will:

- Always play the game fairly and in the right spirit.
- Be aware of the impact of bad language; keep spectators and members of the public - including children - in mind.
- Never verbally abuse a match official, player or spectator based their appearance, race, religion, gender or sexuality. Doing so could lead to dismissal from the field, suspension and possible police action.
- Never physically assault a match official, player or spectator. Doing so could lead to dismissal from the field, suspension and possible police action.
- Help to create a safe and inclusive environment both on and off the pitch.
- Report all allegations of abuse or poor practice to the Club Welfare Officer.
- Not to abuse, neglect, harm or discriminate against anyone; or act in a way that may be interpreted as such.
- Adhere to the club's safeguarding policy, rules and regulations.
- Attend the match with correct kit, this includes black shorts and gold socks.
- Arrive on time. If for any reason I may be late, I will inform my captain as soon as possible.
- Respect the decisions made by my captain.
- Not drop out from the game at short notice. This is unfair to other players who may have been left out, so that I could play. If I have a valid reason, I will inform my captain. Failure to contact my captain will result in being reported to the disciplinary committee.

Selection, finances and expected conduct.

- I understand, if I have made myself available to play, I will be expected to represent any team within the Old Wilsonians football club, as per rule 11 of the OWFC rules.
- I will sign up to the FA Matchday app.
- I will pay my annual and weekly subs on time. If I am unable to do this, I will inform the club treasurer who may be able to assist.
- I will conduct myself in such a manner as not to bring the Old Wilsonians football club into disrepute.
- I will not be involved with/under the influence of any drugs or illegal substances whilst representing the football club, in line with the OWFC drugs policy.
- When playing at home, I will help when required to offer hospitality to the visiting teams and complete requested duties.
- I understand the expectation that I support the club with fundraising events and activities.
- I understand that I need to provide the club with any personal data required for registration and/or safeguarding purposes.
- I will refrain from any criminal activity. I will represent the club with integrity and honesty.

I understand: If I do not follow the Code, I may expect to:

- Be cautioned, sin binned or sent off by the match officials, depending on the nature of the offence.
 - Be asked to apologize to whoever I have offended or abused.
 - Be disciplined by my club via the disciplinary committee, including being substituted, dropped, given a formal warning, suspended from training or matches or a permanent suspension from the club. This will depend on the nature of the offence.
 - Be disciplined by the County Football Association, including being fined or suspended for a number of matches depending on the nature of the offence.
 - Be handed a permanent exclusion by the FA or County Football Association if the offence is deemed serious enough.
- Declaration: I agree to abide by the conditions above and follow any guidance or policy as set out by Old Wilsonians football club, The AFA (County FA) or the Football Association.

A draw the week prior, and the boys were off to North London for round 2 in a top of the table clash with Southgate County. Victoria meet, picked up Jeeven on the Underground; Steadford & Kirby waiting for us in the changing rooms & we were ready to rock n' roll - once James got his boot bags on.

It was a tight affair, with the 1s boys taking hold of the majority of possession. Young buck Tucker marked his debut in goal by taking an early boot to the shoulder, which he had to shove back into place just as his mate Wan Bissaka taught him.

Though building some nice play from back to front, the Old Boys couldn't find the net; and were caught at the back by County's #9, who battled, found a through ball to the Winger who's first touch wide and smart finish saw the home side take the lead. The best chance of the half fell to Farmer on the penalty spot, who slashed wide - 1-0 at the break.

The second half continued similarly to the first, with the 1s boys maintaining good possession, though unable to break through to create too many chances. A strike from Steadford drew a smart block, and Farmer fired wide of the far post, bearing down the right.

However it was the home side again who were the more clinical, making the most of a rare loose ball from the OWs midfield. The County winger bore down on goal from the halfway line, wove his way through the OWs defence, and slotted nicely into the far corner to make it 2-0.

The final 15 minutes were frantic, with the home side penned in their final third, but managing to throw bodies on the line. A late free kick from Jeeven found Cooper at the far post, who nodded back into the far corner to make it 2-1. The final throw of the game saw a Beatson flick into the 6 yard box, Southgate scrambled it to the edge of the box only to find Cooper. It was as though we were back in the Four Thieves as Cooper danced his way through challenges, and fired an effort towards the back post; past the outstretched heads of Steadford and Wright; and crucially past the post. 2-1 to the home side at FT.

Spirits were dampened briefly, worsened by a 20 minute walk to the clubhouse across agricultural farmland; then the night really begun. Rallied at the clubhouse by chip-shop chips, Kirby getting his first round in of the year, and plans for the 1s big night stirring. Finsbury Park was the first stop, lovely Guinness and even better Jaegerbombs for Old Gold legend Beatson who had us teetering with tales of his Thai adventures with Mr Jones Senior. Those remaining were feeling fully buzzed on the train to C Palace; where the last men standing put the world to rites; agreed that Winchmore Hill were getting it next week, and rounded off with a Peri King burger, 10 wings, piri chips & an Apple Tango - helluva night. Another mouthwatering away day to Enfield this week - Winchmore Hill away. The Victoria massif grouped in force for the 11.50 meet; though Playfoot's 11.33 mishap had us twiddling thumbs; but in true non sibi sed omnibus style - no man was left behind. Pulling up at the ground, the sun was beaming, and the pitches looked slick. Steadford, & Kirby again sitting oddly close together in an otherwise empty changing room sparked some intrigue, but no time for questions as it was time to get pitchside.

Trying a new formation this week, seemed to cause more confusion in the oppo than OWs boys; as the first 10 mins had the home side openly reeling. It was another tight, scrappy affair; with the Winchmore Hill ultras providing decent pitchside support. The best chance of the first half came as Jeeven slotted through to Wright, who collected towards the edge of the box, and fired a volley which he "caught too well"; firing just over the bar. The boys held strong at the back, and the deadlock was unable to be broken in the first 45.

The FA were clearly in need of some end of season doo cash; as the ref was dishing out yellows like they were going out of fashion. All 3 of the cautioned OWs got a date with the bench, and we were off for the second half. The scrappy affair continued, without too many chances opening up. The deadlock was broken in a freak way - a Winchmore long throw into the box, flicked on and tantalisingly drifted to the far post, and trickled in. 1-0 to the home side.

A smart save from Tucker kept the deficit to 1; though a second shortly followed. Another long-throw, flicked on again by the Winchmore forward, this time finding a man free for a tap in inside the 6-yard box. 2-0 down, and flashbacks to Southgate County the week before. A similar finish followed.

A bullet from Steadford fired wide, Farmer couldn't get his shot off breaking into the box. A late free kick from Jeeven found Wright with a free header, which rebounded off the bar, only for Steadford to bundled home from 2 yard - 2-1. A free kick in the final minute saw Tucker bursting forward from his own box; and challenging Wright for the would-be winning header in the box - however, it wasn't to be. The final whistle blew, 2-1 to the home side.

First Half

On a heavy pitch, Old Wilsonians started strongly and took an early, well-deserved lead. Brandon Bryan opened the scoring with a brilliantly placed 30-yard strike, giving the visitors a 1–0 advantage.

For the opening stages, OWs dominated the physical side of the game, consistently winning 50/50 challenges and controlling the tempo. Debutant Cody Wilkins impressed at full-back with a commanding performance, while Paul Hartnup — playing his first competitive match in over a decade — showed outstanding composure, dictating play from midfield.

As the half progressed, Old Reigatian began to impose themselves. Their long-ball approach caused growing problems, and they increasingly won the second balls. Their pressure eventually paid off shortly before the break, and they went into half-time with a deserved equaliser.

Half-Time Message

Manager Alex Forbes delivered a clear and encouraging team talk:



- Win the 50/50s
- Communicate constantly
- Play in Reigatian's half
- Force mistakes

The message was simple — if we matched the work-rate, the game was there for the taking.

Second Half

Despite a competitive restart, Old Reigatian capitalised again from another long ball to take a 2–1 lead. A third followed from a rash challenge inside the box, and the fourth arrived late, just 20 seconds from the final whistle. OWs were competitive throughout but were undone by recurring issues: allowing the game to stretch, leaving large gaps in midfield, and losing communication at key moments. These lapses led to switches-off that Reigatian punished clinically.

Manager's Reflection

This young side has been close in every match this season bar one — the talent is clearly there. What's missing is consistency in key moments:

- Staying compact
- Talking throughout the match
- Winning second balls
- Avoiding stretched phases of play

On ***Sunday March 25th*** there will be a match against Lloyds Vets based on two squads of players whose combined ages, per side, needs to reach 1,000 years. To date I have had two sets of shirts provided free by the Falcon Barter Company. These are gold & black (OWs) and blues (Lloyds). There are 20 shirts, which can be kept by the respective clubs. In addition I have a ball sponsored for £100, organised two referees, Mike Harris and Andy McClinton, one patrolling each half of the pitch, plus an offer from two other referees to run/walk the lines.

I already have 11 volunteers, namely Gerry Adams. 'Mac', Mike Pilgrim, Mike Kenderick, Peter Wakeford, Terry Adams, Fred Brindle, Ian Rayworth, Rod Warboys, Chris Cowell and Jim Matthews and only need another nine players to complete, so please let me know if you would like to join them.

It would be useful if you could get sponsorship for playing – minutes on the pitc etc. Les Wilks has got himself sponsored for not playing! Sponsorship forms are available from me, so even if you cannot attend on the day, you may wish to sponsor some of the above named players.

I suggest that we split the sponsorship 50/50 between the Club and an agreed charity, possibly St John's Ambulance or a Hospice would be appropriate,

Guests are more than welcome and Pat George will be in attendance in the role of the ream's physiotherapist – now there's an opportunity for you to have your body overhauled.

There will be food providrd, so I need to know how many are turning up, so if you are bringing the fsmily, let me know so that I can cater accordingly. I look forward to hearing from you as soon as possible.

This game started off in a scrappy fashion, but the 2nds gradually took control, applying pressure to the Colfe's defence and this finally paid off when John Lambourne hit a long ball through the middle, which looked to be the goal-keeper's, but **'YOGI' TAYLOR** rushed in bravely to head home.

Our second goal followed quickly when **PAT JOHNSON** picked the ball up just inside their half and did one of his well-renowned sprints with the ball towards the goal, avoiding several players on the way. Finally, when it looked as though he would lose the ball, Pat unleashed a good right-footed shot from just outside the box which just crept inside the post.

At this stage Colfes came back into the game and looked like equalising. We were then awarded a free-kick just inside their half which Bill Morley cleverly slotted through to Glen Hamds, who turned on the ball and shot.
