## OWFC Business Code of Conduct / Annual Subs

A new season is upon us . With a further influx of juniors and schoolboys , plus training and a couple of teams playing through the summer. Our hopes are high. We have 7 teams on Saturday & the Vets on Sundays playing league football . Supervets will continue to play friendlies on Sundays.

We have kept annual subs for 21s & over in employment to £150 & under 21s in employment £75, both pay £10 weekly subs . If you are playing 4 or less games you will pay £20 match fees , but no annual subs. Junior members paying annual subs to the junior section & schoolboys pay no annual subs but pay £5 weekly subs. Vets due to the number of games pay annual subs , Supervets pay £50 annual subs & £10 per game match .

Unemployed please chat to your skipper or Stu Dunk (treasurer or me (asst treasurer) and we will agree something that is workable for you as we want you to play . Annual subs are due on 30th September 2025 . We are using Pitchero & you should have an email to confirm your details, receive newsletters , about events also paying your annual subs or outstanding fines like yellow and red cards.

Why the rise in annual subs ? our rent to the association has gone up by 7.5% this season taking it above £24,000 per annum . The reason is ground maintenance (looking after both hayes & Hawesdown) costs £71,000 per year (up from £60,000 last season due mainly to the extra cost of running Hawesdown), utilities has gone from £21,000 in 2021 to over £54,000 in 2025. So it is important you pay your annual subs on time as we look to break even. Its also important you support events not only so you meet players from other teams but also have some fun & hopefully we make a bit of money , which will hopefully keep your annual subs as low as possible Also find a code of conduct we expect all our member to follow. Please read them as this is the minimum we expect as a club. Here's to a great season , good luck & enjoy

### Code of Conduct

As a representative of the Old Wilsonians Football Club, I agree that;

On and off the pitch, I will:

- Always play the game fairly and in the right spirit.
- Be aware of the impact of bad language; keep spectators and members of the public - including children - in mind.
- Never verbally abuse a match official, player or spectator based their appearance, race, religion, gender or sexuality. Doing so could lead to dismissal from the field, suspension and possible police action.
- Never physically assault a match official, player or spectator. Doing so could lead to dismissal from the field, suspension and possible police action.
- Help to create a safe and inclusive environment both on and off the pitch.
- Report all allegations of abuse or poor practice to the Club Welfare Officer.
- Not to abuse, neglect, harm or discriminate against anyone; or act in a way that may be interpreted as such.
- Adhere to the club's safeguarding policy, rules and regulations.
- Attend the match with correct kit, this includes black shorts and gold socks.
- Arrive on time. If for any reason I may be late, I will inform my captain as soon as possible.
- Respect the decisions made by my captain.
- Not drop out from the game at short notice. This is unfair to other players who may have been left out, so that I could play. If I have a valid reason, I will inform my captain. Failure to contact my captain will result in being reported to the disciplinary committee.

### Code of Conduct continued

Selection, finances and expected conduct.

- I understand, if I have made myself available to play, I will be expected to represent any team within the Old Wilsonians football club, as per rule 11 of the OWFC rules.
- I will sign up to the FA Matchday app.
- I will pay my annual and weekly subs on time. If I am unable to do this, I will inform the club treasurer who may be able to assist.
- I will conduct myself in such a manner as not to bring the Old Wilsonians football club into disrepute.
- I will not be involved with/under the influence of any drugs or illegal substances whilst representing the football club, in line with the OWFC drugs policy.
- When playing at home, I will help when required to offer hospitality to the visiting teams and complete requested duties.
- I understand the expectation that I support the club with fundraising events and activities.
- I understand that I need to provide the club with any personal data required for registration and/or safeguarding purposes.
- I will refrain from any criminal activity. I will represent the club with integrity and honesty.

### Code of Conduct continued

I understand: If I do not follow the Code, I may expect to:

- Be cautioned, sin binned or sent off by the match officials, depending on the nature of the offence.
  - Be asked to apologize to whoever I have offended or abused.
  - Be disciplined by my club via the disciplinary committee, including being substituted, dropped, given a formal warning, suspended from training or matches or a permanent suspension from the club. This will depend on the nature of the offence.
  - Be disciplined by the County Football Association, including being fined or suspended for a number of matches depending on the nature of the offence.
  - Be handed a permanent exclusion by the FA or County Football Association if the offence is deemed serious enough.
- Declaration: I agree to abide by the conditions above and follow any guidance or policy as set out by Old Wilsonians football club, The AFA (County FA) or the Football Association.

## OWFC 1s end of season report 25/26

The 25/26 season has been a funny kettle of fish for the 1s. Following a league win last year, and a league merger over the Summer; we were keen to stamp our authority on a new league. We were off to a flyer, and quickly topped the table whilst simultaneously getting all the Cups out the way to make sure we could really focus on the league. Frustratingly, before long, the league was cut down to just 7 teams, with 3 dropping out. Not only did that scratch 2 wins and 6 points off our tally; but meant we'd have 4 games fewer for the year.

Regardless, we found ourselves top at Christmas, and unbeaten in the league right the way through to mid-Feb. Early highlights shone with a hattrick in GW1 from youngster Freddie Inglis to see off Winchmore Hill; 2 goals in 2 mins to turn over Sinjuns; Gowtham Jeeven sending a foray of corners straight into the trees at home to Bank of England; a Kieran Steadford double, and last minute winner away to Lyonians.

Then came 6 weeks without a fixture between November and January, muddled with a helluva lot of rain at the turn of the year; and we began dropping key points. We started the year with 4 draws on the bounce - an uneventful draw away to West Wickham, followed by a 2-0 lead thrown at home to Actonians, a 0-0 thriller at Hayes with Ignatian, and another 2-0 lead thrown at home to eventual league winners Southgate County - definitely 4 points down the swanny, though still unbeaten at this point. Amongst those, some great performances - MoM's for Kaya Tumkaya's clean sheet marking our one and only for the season so far; and Jake O'Sullivan's goal-scoring 1s debut.

## Old Wilsonians 2<sup>nd</sup> XI Season 2025-26 Season Report

Old Wilsonians 2nd XI returned a very similar squad to the previous season, with a few key additions in places. With the majority of the squad one year older, the hopes were high for a strong season.

The season started off a little sluggish in the league however a number of strong cup runs meant just four league fixtures were completed before Christmas, with a mixed bag of results, the 2s sat with 1 win, 2 draws and 1 loss at the turn of the year.

A quarter final in the old boys cup was the height of the cup runs and an unfortunate 1-0 loss to eventual winners was a tough one to swallow. Rumour has it Max's penalty is still floating about in the atmosphere around Enfield. The only dropped points came in a 0-0 draw, the first and only time the coveted veo camera was used as it recorded 31 OW shots and absolutely no goals. It was a day where the entire team channelled their inner George Catton who likely managed a shot to goal ratio of at least 1:100 in the season.

A particular highlight of the good run was a long over-due away win on the hallowed turf of Hackney Marshes at the 4<sup>th</sup> time of asking for some of the squad, that was followed by an extended visit to the pubs of Hackney Wick.

Off the pitch, the team has also developed since last season with several memorable post-match sessions throughout the campaign. Away days in Hackney and on the road back from Enfield were particular highlights. A few more shower appearances have also been made by the young team though rumour has it Shelts got a little close after the big win on Hackney Marshes and George hasn't been seen back in the showers since. The younger team members haven't however quite got the kit washing down quite yet. A shout out must also go to a number of players across the club who have helped out when squad numbers were low across the 1s and 2s, with all contributing massively when involved to keep the 2s run of form going. Goalkeepers have especially helped out, with 7 different keepers manning the sticks for the 2s throughout the season!

With promotion now all but mathematically secured, and a title still within reach — requiring four wins from four remaining fixtures — the 2s are looking to finish the job and sign off on what has been a very good campaign.

## OWFC 5<sup>th</sup> XI Down The Fives!

The 5XI began the campaign with a quiet sense of confidence, the kind built on the back of a strong previous season that saw them impress in the league and lift the Old Boys Cup. As ever, preparations got underway on 1 June, building toward the traditional inter-house tournament. This year it was House Camberwell who took the honor's, expertly led by club legend **Jonny Q**, setting a competitive tone before a ball had even been kicked in earnest.

Preseason only added to the optimism. The 5XI turned heads with a spirited win over the 3XI, and despite the departure of a promising schoolboy talent to university, a number of new faces slotted in seamlessly. There was a genuine sense that this side had both depth and momentum — that the trajectory was upward.

Reality, however, proved less accommodating.

Despite an opening day victory against Dorking, a string of narrow defats followed, setting the tone for what would become a challenging campaign. The step up in the new league was immediately apparent. Opponents were sharper, more clinical, and far less forgiving of the 5XI's recurring issues — most notably the absence of a settled goalkeeper and a growing injury list that disrupted any hope of consistency.

If there was one defining pattern to the season, it was the alarming tendency to fall behind early. Time and again, the 5XI found themselves three goals down within the opening 20 minutes, left chasing games before they had properly settled into them. What followed, though, became something of a trademark: spirited, often impressive attacking responses that turned matches into chaotic, high-scoring affairs. Unfortunately, more often than not, those efforts fell just short, resulting in a string of entertaining but ultimately fruitless defeats.

Relegation now looms large, and it would be easy to frame the season purely in those terms. But that wouldn't tell the full story.

Because beneath the results lies a team that never stopped playing, never stopped believing they could get back into matches, and consistently showed attacking quality that few sides could ignore. The integration of new players has been a clear success, and the resilience shown — even in the face of early setbacks — speaks to a strong dressing room culture.

Fix the defensive fragility, find stability between the posts, and retain the attacking intent, and the foundations are there for a much stronger campaign ahead.

For the 5XI, this season may end in disappointment on paper. But in terms of growth, character, and glimpses of real quality, there is plenty to build on.

### Player of the Season

Selecting a Player of the Season for the 5XI is no easy task, particularly in a year where commitment and character often mattered as much as raw performance.

**Oscar Arzente** deserves enormous credit for a superb debut campaign. Slotting in at left back, he showed maturity beyond his experience, handling difficult assignments with composure while also hinting at a more attacking future. A player with clear potential and one who will only grow in importance.

**Leon Kapszweski's** (Cap-Chev-Ski's) season came in two parts, but his impact after returning cannot be overstated. From the moment he found his rhythm, he set the tone in matches — energetic, decisive, and often the spark the side needed when chasing games.

**Merv Nicholas** embodied the definition of a team player. Whether at right back, left back, centre back, or even stepping in goal when needed, his willingness to do whatever was asked of him never wavered. In a season disrupted by injuries and instability, that kind of reliability was invaluable.

**James Doyle** turned back the clock with a series of tireless displays on the wing, combining experience with end product to become a consistent creative outlet. Meanwhile, **Jermaine Benson** produced some truly commanding performances, defying the years with authority and composure that anchored the side during difficult spells. But above all, one name stands out.

## Danny Holmes.

In his 30th year, Holmes didn't just contribute — he defined the team. At the heart of everything good about the 5XI, he epitomised the spirit, resilience, and character that carried the side through a turbulent season. Whether driving the team forward, lifting those around him, or setting the standard week in, week out, his influence was impossible to ignore.

As Alex Forbes aptly put it, he's "some player for the future" — a line that perfectly captures both the irony and the enduring quality of Holmes. In a season of challenges, he was the constant. A deserved Player of the Season.

### End of Season Report
